She noted the need to engage with non-farmers and others that are unintentionally engaged in harmful practices. She also expressed the need to bring conservation into the schools.</li> <li>GT - expressed the desire to continue with the district's current projects and work with the schools and community to educate the next generation on conservation.</li> <li>EP- asserted the need to focus on the active district registry, the soil health initiative, and the work with the feral swine.</li> </ul>

Thoughts and Suggestions by the Board regarding projects for the upcoming year:

- JS- Suggested tree planting work.
- MR Noted that she has a small farm that can be used for conservation work or demonstrations for the districts
- MT- expressed concerns surrounding the invasive species, especially feral swine. She noted that it has become a public safety concern. MT stressed the importance of continuing work for the farmer stress grant.
- JA noted the desire to focus on assessments first for the farmer stress grant and the active district registry. She also brought up a Highschool Conservation Stewardship Program that the NGSWCD is trying to implement.
- MA- noted that he is very knowledgeable of the feral swine damage and expressed the need for both fencing and trapping to reduce the numbers and thus treat. He also expressed the need to control the invasive plant species and preserve the native species.

- This was developed through a grant with the USDA NRCS.
- Input for the plan was provided by the Local Working Group.
- Goal for the review of the plan: to help in the creation of the FY24, FY25 program activities plan and budget.

EP presented the GLRP Top Resource Concerns (see presentation)

- **Soil Quality Limitations** 
  - o Goal 1: Build the capacity to do monitoring and testing of soils in Guam, and identify human or natural threats to soil quality, loss, and degradation
  - o Goal 2: Educate land users about the importance of soil testing to understand soil conditions, soil conservation practices, and practices of sustainably increasing soil quality along with ways to prevent soil loss and degradation
  - Goal 3: To improve soil fertility and stewardship using local resources
- Long Term Protection of Land
  - o Goal 1: Update and promote Guam's agriculture and natural resource protection policies with NRCS though Local Working Groups
